**RECIPE OF THE MONTH****Hot Chocolate Pudding**

4oz unsalted Butter  
 4oz molasses sugar  
 4oz self-raising flour mixed  
 with 1 1/2 oz cocoa powder  
 2 Eggs



Mix all ingredients together. Put in a dish (suitable for microwave) with plenty of room for pudding to rise.

Mix together 1oz of molasses sugar and 1oz cocoa powder and sprinkle on top of pudding.

Pour a small cup of boiling water over the pudding. Then microwave for 4-6 minutes. Serve with cream or ice-cream.

It may sound odd - but it works and is delicious!!
